The basis of an efficient crisis management system is ensuring that those with responsibility have the information, resources, and authority they require. This requires that they maintain continuous insurance coverage for students and staff, relationships with local health care providers and civil authorities, and guidelines necessary for addressing crises. It also includes their on-going preparation so that they can take preventive steps well before a crisis arises or a noncritical matter turns into a crisis.
